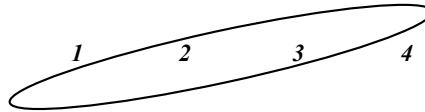

Sky View

Proposal for temporary exterior sculpture

“Sky View” is a blue nylon shelled Steel structure 15’ H x 8.5’ W sculpture that could either be constructed on regular grounds or on a concrete foundation, with supporting cables.

The sculpture accommodates one to three people at a time. Through the top of the sculpture the viewers are given a 2’x 2’ view space in which to perceive the sky. There a perception of an ever-changing canvas takes place of daytime and nighttime star and constellation movements. The outer walls of the sculpture are constructed of nylon in order to keep pace with the rhythms of the wind patterns. Sound is also altered in accordance with the shape of the structure and the way wind passes through the structure.

In the piece, a sense of isolationism is established in order to call importance to the 2’ x 2’ space. The structure is about that space and
